Channel dredging project underway

Dredging of two channels on the north side of Round Lake has begun. The project will be removing years of silt from the channels. The channels have never been dredged and they have gone from a depth of six feet to about 12 to 18 inches, making them barely passable, and causing silt to back up into the lake

"The village has wanted to dredge the channels for over 20 years," said Mayor Rich Hill. "Last year we decided the timing was right and we were able to fund the project, so the dredging could begin this spring."

The North channel begins at Clarendon Drive and is already complete. The shoreline will be stabilized to prevent further erosion. The dredging of the channel leading to the dam along Cedar Lake Road will begin after Labor Day to allow use of the lake during the summer boating season.

The dredged materials will be transported to two locations to de-water the material. One is property on Fairfield owned by the Round Lake Area Park District; the other is property owned by the Village of Round Lake Beach on Hook Lake.

Free wood chips

Mosquito spraying

The Village of Round Lake Beach has contracted with Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management to begin larvae control in May. Spraying for adult mosquitoes begins when the weather conditions and the presence of mosquitoes merit it.
