Housing Programs That Help: Learn More on January 29th

Mayor Hill will interview senior staff from Community Partners for Affordable Housing, a nonprofit agency that offers a variety of housing programs that can help you buy a home, repair your home, and prevent losing your home to foreclosure. As one of the Village's most-valued community partners, CPAH has assisted literally hundreds of RLB residents with their housing needs. CPAH has also acquired dozens of vacant and foreclosed homes in Round Lake Beach for rehab and resale, thereby reducing the number of abandoned and distressed homes that have lingered in town as a result of the foreclosure crisis.

Know The Codes: Outdoor Holiday and Decorative Lighting

Be sure to check the packaging on your outdoor holiday lighting. Are your lights rated for a maximum of 90 days of usage? Most are, as their design is such that using these products for longer periods can result in electric shock and fire due to the elements, consumer misuse and critter damage. Per Village code, holiday lights must be taken down within 90 days for these safety reasons. Residents also appreciate this for aesthetic reasons, as your neighbors probably don't want to see a lighted Santa in July! We encourage you to consider buying lights rated for year-round use next time you upgrade or replace your lighting. Not only are they safer, but a year-round rating is required per Village Code for (non-holiday) decorative lighting.

Snow and Ice Control

During a snow or ice event everyone is tasked with making our streets reasonably safe for residents. This responsibility includes providing snow and ice removal for the Village's 80 centerline miles of streets, 92 cul-de-sacs, and Village owned parking lots. There are several ways you can help keep the Village safe during the winter:

- **NO PARKING on any street within the village limits at any time after snow begins to fall and for a period of eight hours after snow stops falling when the snow on the streets exceeds two inches in depth, or until snow removal operations are completed.**
- When you are driving in snow and icy conditions, you will be sharing the road

with snow plows. The two most important things to remember:

- Slow Down
 - Stay Back, Don't Crowd the Plow
- Please DO NOT throw snow from your property into the streets since this can create a hazardous condition.
 - Shovel snow before it turns to ice to limit the need for deicing chemicals like rock salt.
 - Use salt substitutes that are less harmful including Calcium Chloride (CaCl₂) and Calcium Magnesium Acetate (CMA).

Mailboxes

Please make sure your mailbox is attached securely to the post so snow mounds or snow from the plow do not dislodge it. The Village will only repair or replace mailboxes/posts that have visual damage from our plow trucks. According to USPS regulations the face of the mailbox must be between six to nine inches back from the edge of the pavement or curb. Height from the ground to the bottom of the mailbox must be between 41 to 43 inches. The deadline for reporting a damaged or broken mailbox or post to Public Works for repair/replacement is **May 1st**.

Electronic Recycling

Electronic Recycling is located on Sunset Drive South of Hawthorne Drive at the gated Sanitary Plant in Round Lake Beach. It is open Monday through Friday 7:30 am to 3:00 pm, Saturday 8:00 am to 1:00 pm. It will not be open on Sundays or Holidays.
